Touring Exhibition

After a hugely successful visit to the Science Museum in London, the Open for Business tour has moved to the University of South Wales, Newport City Campus until 2 January 2015. Next stop is Plymouth City Museum & Art Gallery, from 17 January to 12 March 2015.

Ben Russell, curator of mechanical engineering at the Science Museum, said the exhibition gave him hope.

"People often say to me that Britain makes nothing any more – this exhibition gives the lie to that. The skills are still here, and the imagination. Britain cannot compete with China or the Far East in mass manufacturing, but oriental workers are not going to accept such low wages for ever: the tide could turn. I'm very upbeat."

"The best thing about Bendiksen's display is the inclusion of video playing in five LCD monitors which look exactly like the black picture frames that house his stills. I've seen this done many times before but it works particularly well here, these small snatches of video are beautifully shot and integrate rather seamlessly into the larger display of photographs."

Spotlight on Bruce Gilden

Bruce Gilden visited London manufacturers. He says:

"Since I'm used to working on commissions, I can adapt quickly to new environments, work very hard and very fast. To work on this project, where I had to realise a number of images in a short period of time, I decided to do colour digital photography. This way I can see the pictures when I'm taking them, which is very important.

My approach is to combine portraits of workers with surreal abstract photographs of the environment in order to bring my personal vision of the place, add another dimension to the traditional setting, and give a new life to customary objects."

Spotlight on David Hurn

David Hurn was commissioned to photograph manufacturing companies in Wales. He says:

"My prime interest is in people or rather the way people react with people or to their environment. I worked with people and their activities where everyone is highly skilled and therefore love their jobs – perhaps a happy workforce means quality goods. All of them are very successful businesses.

I have mainly simply observed, but have included a few semi-posed portraits."
